FIG-Commission 7 is mourning the passing of an early and strong supporter, and a long-time friend. Shortly after his 90th birthday, Prof. Dr. Hab. Andrzej Hopfer peacefully passed away on 15 December in his home country Poland.

Many know him as a property appraiser, but to us, Andrzej was a committed surveyor adding substantially to the cause of the cadastre from very early on. He was the Polish delegate to FIG-Commission 7 from 1975 to 2011, and its Chair from 1983-1986. Andrzej contributed much to the international profile of the Polish Association of Surveyors, was actively involved in the preparation of several key publications, and

organized and initiated many international conferences in Poland. In the year 2000, Andrzej was named an Honorary Member of FIG.

We all are thankful and honoured to have known Andrzej. FIG, the Commission 7, and we all have benefitted from his commitment, vision, and innovation.

Andrzej, thank you very much for your wisdom and friendship.

Andrzej was a real patriot and leader in the new Poland. So many more wonderful memories of our lifelong friendship. I could go on and on, and even write a book about our times together in FIG, as academics and most importantly as friends.

Today will be a sad day for me. I have tears in my eyes.
